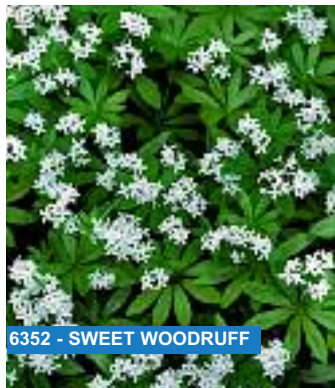
SOAPWORT

(*Saponaria ocymoides*) Sow directly outdoors early May or late fall. Hardy to Zone 3. Sow 25g per two square metres.

Flowers June/July. Grows to a mature height of 15cm (6").

SWEET WOODRUFF

(*Galium odoratum*) Grows well in partial shade or woodland settings. Zone 4.

6355 - CREEPING THYME

THYME

5100 sds/g Direct garden sow early May or start indoors March 1st. Germinate at 20C/70F for 14 to 21 days, sometimes longer. Outdoors grow plants in full sun. Dormant fall sowings are very effective too. Hardy to Zone 4 Five grams sows 6 square metres (30 ft²).

6355 – CREEPING THYME

Thrives in full sun. Grows 15cm (6") tall. Grows well in between patio stones. Small purple flowers appear early July and produce a nice lemon scent when brushed. 25g sows 150 square metres (1,500 square feet).

PERENNIALS & BIENNIALS

Enjoy perennials in any season.

With the variations in flowering times and duration of bloom, the features of a perennial garden provide a succession of bloom which is always changing as the seasons do. Some simply lose their leaves, some stay evergreen and grasses wave in the breeze for a four season show.

Mixed plantings of annuals and perennials are a great way to provide more bloom for a longer time. There is less planting year after year as the perennials gradually fill in and take over.

With the ever increasing interest in native grasses many gardeners now mass plant with a limited number of species rather than going to an "English perennial garden" look. These gardens are alive with carefully thought-out displays of contrasting textures and colour, taking advantage of natural seasonal changes.



6370 – Alyssum SAXATILE

ALYSSUM

(*Alyssum compactum*)

1200 sds/g

Start seed 6 to 8 weeks early indoors in soil temperatures of 20C/68F. Germination should take place in 5 to 10 days. Grow on at cooler temperatures of 15C (60F). Seed will germinate better when pre-chilled for 10 to 15 days. Zone 3

6370 – SAXATILE

A popular dwarf Alpine Alyssum that's loaded with vivid yellow blooms for rock gardens and borders. Foliage is light grey-green. Blooms May/June. Matures to a garden height of 15cm (6").

ASCLEPIAS

(*Asclepias tuberosa*)

Easy to grow. Sow indoors early March for late summer flowering the first year. Soil temperature should be about 20C/68F. Grow-on at cooler temperatures of 15C (60F). Zone 3

6375 – BUTTERFLY MILKWEED

Bright, sun-loving plants are filled with brilliant orange flowers 10cm (4") across. Typically 60cm (24") tall and flower abundantly during June through frost. It's a favourite of butterflies. Heat and drought tolerant.

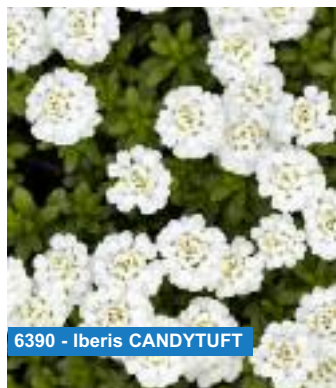
BLACK EYED SUSAN

(*Rudbeckia hirta*) 3700 sds/g A must for any sunny garden. Rudbeckia take more heat and drought than most. Sow outdoors September through October or early spring. Zone 3.

Expect blooms throughout the summer July to September. A charming Ontario native plant. Golden yellow flowers with dark centres. Trouble free. Drought resistant. Blooms best in full sun. Will tolerate a little shade but expect fewer flowers. Height 60-90cm (2-3')

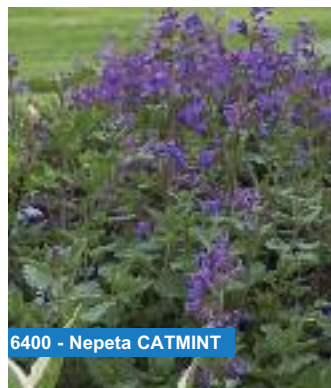

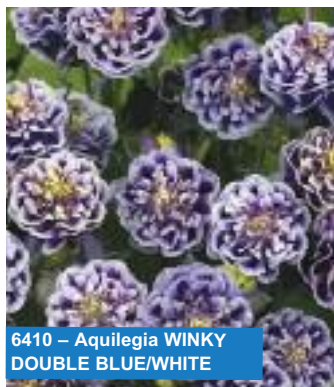

Spicy fragrance and lots of colour make carnations ideal for the border or cutting. Beautifully large double flowers in red, white, yellow and scarlet adorn these perennial favourites. Height 45cm (15"). Zone 5

ENGLISH DAISY BELLS

(*Bellis perennis*) 4800 sds/g
Sow mid February, on top of soil but do not cover as light aids germination. Keep well watered. Zone 4

Biennial. Double daisy like flowers with stems rising from tufts of shiny green foliage. Blooms early April into May.

CANDYTUFT

(*Iberis*) 350 sds/g
Sow directly outdoors after danger of frost. Start indoors at 21C (70F) eight weeks early. Grow on at much cooler temperatures of 12C (50F). Blooms May-June in full sun. Zone 3

6390 - IBERIS SEMPERVIRENS

Compact, spreading plants bloom through spring and early summer. Growing 30cm (12") tall, a great rockery plant or groundcover in dry soil.

Bell shaped flowers with a flat base flowers of white, pink, deep blue and rose. Garden height is 75cm (30").

Flowers first year. Drought tolerant. Sow indoors in February. Germinate at 20C (70F) for 10 days. Sow directly outdoors late April.

Start seed indoors anytime before March. Germinate at 20C (70F). Pods form during the months of August and September. Zone 4

Very attractive pleated blooms in blue and white. Compact. Great in containers or mass plantings. 45 cm (18") tall.

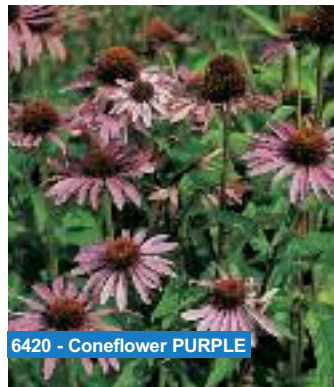

CONEFLOWER

(*Echinacea pupurea*)

265 sds/g

Outstanding perennials. Tolerant of full sun and partial shade. Attracts beneficial insects such as pollinators and butterflies. Folklore cold remedy. Often flowers the same year from seed, if started indoors January or February. Germinate at 20-25C (70-80F) in 15 days. Zone 3

6420 - PURPLE CONEFLOWER

Pretty, long lasting, daisy-like blooms of light purple with contrasting centres of dark maroon. Tall, stately plants average 1m (39") height.

COREOPSIS

(*Coreopsis spp.*) 350 sds/g

Sow directly outdoors or 10 weeks early indoors for early summer flowering the first year. Sow outdoors anytime April to June. Thin 30cm (12") apart. Self-seeds very easily when established. Divide older plants every 3 to 4 years. Germinates at 21C (70F), grow-on at cooler 12C/50F. Zone 3

6430 - EARLY SUNRISE

A very popular and easy to grow perennial that requires little care and maintenance. Large, fluffy flowers of rich golden yellow with 45cm (18") long, sturdy stems. Excellent in the border and for cutting. Flowers retain their colour well when dried.

Start 8 to 10 weeks early indoors. Germination requires 14 to 21 days. Grow on at cooler temperatures of 15C/60F. Zone 3

6625 - SHASTA DAISY

Free flowering plants with large snow white, single flowers with yellow centres. No perennial garden should be without this outstanding plant.

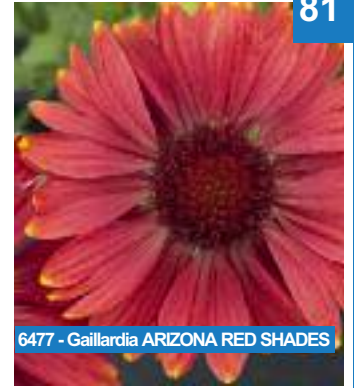

Trouble free. Start 8 to 10 weeks early indoors. Pre-chill seed for 24 hours prior to sowing. Germinate at 18C (65F). Zone 3.

6435 – PACIFIC GIANTS MIXED

Large flower spikes filled with 5cm (2") double florets. A balanced blend of solids and bi-colours. Mildew resistant; good for backgrounds and borders but requires staking. Height 150cm (5 ft.).

When starting seed under lights use 12-14 hours of light per day. Use a timer to ensure correct lighting interval.

ECHINOPS

(*Echinops ritro*) 75 sds/g
Start indoors early March. Germinate at 21C (70F). Press seed into contact with the soil but do not cover as light aids germination. Zone 3

6445 – GLOBE THISTLE

A splendid "everlasting" flower producing globular, violet-blue ball-shaped blooms on tall 75-90cm (30-36") stems. Excellent dried flower. Foliage is finely cut with a sawtooth shape.

FORGET-ME-NOT

(*Myosotis*) 1,500 sds/g
Hardy biennial. Prefers a slightly moist and shaded area. Germination is best when soil is cool at 15C (60F) for 10 days. Direct sow June to August for spring blooms. Cover seed lightly and keep moist. Zone 3.

6460 – ALPESTRIS BLUE

Compact, ball-shaped plants are loaded with indigo blue flowers. Very easy to grow and re-seeds quite freely. Mature garden height 15cm (6").

FOXGLOVE

(*Digitalis pupurea*)
4,600 sds/g
Biennial. Self-seeds in the garden. Start seeds in March at 20C (70F) Note – seeds and plants are toxic. Zone 4

Hybrid Foxglove. Early bloomer, bell-shaped blooms, spotted throats in pink, rose, purple, cream, primrose and white. Performs well in sun or partial shade. Matures to 1.5m (5') height.

(*Gaillardia aristata*)

Blanket Flower. Easy to grow Adaptable and thrive on summer heat and full sun. Sow indoors or outdoors anytime from April through August. Germination 25C (80F) for 21 days. Light aids germination. Zone 3

6470 – GRANDIFLORA

Clear, bright golden yellow daisy-like flowers highlighted with attractive maroon-red centres. Ideal for cutting and at the back of the perennial border. Height 75cm (30").

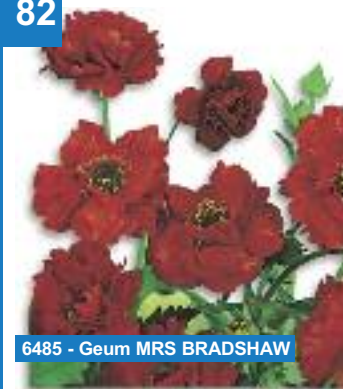
SHADES

Arizona Red blankets the garden with brilliant 10cm (4") yellow and red flowers. Thrives in the poor soil locations under full sun. It blooms earlier and longer than other Gaillardias—well into the fall. Compact plants mature to 30 cm (12") height. Flowers the first year from an early March sowing. Pkt of 10 seeds \$2.79

6480 – MESA YELLOW

The first F1 Gaillardia from seed. Vigorous 45cm (18") plants are loaded with brilliant yellow 7.5cm (3") daisy like blooms. A butterfly favourite. Plants bloom throughout the summer. A great container plant too! AAS Winner 2010.

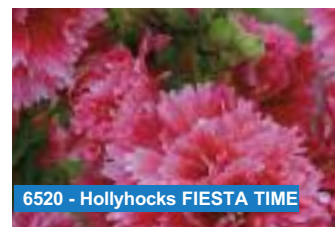

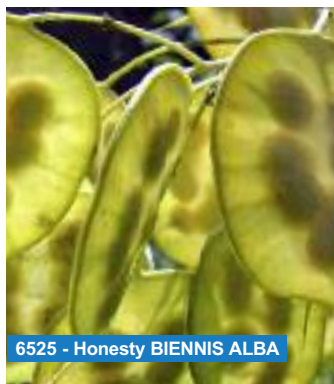

(*Geum hybridum*) 250 sds/g
Start seed indoors mid to late February or outdoors in May for bloom the following June/July. Requires 28 days or more to germinate at 20C (70F). Zone 5.

6485 – MRS BRADSHAW

Plants are very heat and drought tolerant and are one of spring's first perennials to bloom. Continues flowering most of the summer. Height 60cm (24"). Best placed at the back of the perennial border. Pkt \$2.79;

GYPSOPHILA

(*Gypsophila paniculata*)

Start seed outdoors May through mid-July in a slightly shaded location for bloom the following year. Space 60cm (24") apart in the garden. Not sold to addresses in BC, AB or SK. Zone 3.

6500 – PANICULATA SINGLE

Billowy mists of tiny white flowers July through August. Excellent fresh or as filler in dried bouquets. Plants grow to 90cm (36").

HEUCHERA

(*Coral Bells*)

One of the easiest and most rewarding perennials you can grow. Start seed indoors January to March germinating at 18C (65F). Outdoors, direct garden sow during May for bloom the following spring.

6510 – BRESSINGHAM HYBRIDS

Graceful, slender stalks 35-40cm (14-16") tall are loaded with dainty bell-shaped red or pink flowers sitting high above bright green heart-shaped foliage. Blooms late May through August in full sun to partial shade. Great for rockeries or borders. Zone 3. Pkt \$2.79



6517 - Hollyhocks DOUBLE APRICOT

HONESTY (LUNARIA)

(*Lunaria biennis*) 509 sds/g
Biennial. Also known as 'Money-Plant' and 'Silver Dollars.' Outdoors, sow seed in June/July for flowers the next year. Indoors, sow early April. Germinate at 20C (70F) for 20 days.

6525 – BIENNIS ALBA

Plants of 90cm (36") height flower freely early summer with shiny, flat, white silvery seed pods. Use for dried bouquets. Will tolerate light shade. Flowers are fragrant, purple, pink or white appearing in clusters in late spring.

(*Alcea rosea*) 110 sds/g
Germinate at 18C (65F) for 28 days. Avoid higher temperatures as it affects germination success. Direct outdoor sowings can be done May to July. Space mature plants 60cm (24") apart in the garden.

6515 – CHATERS DOUBLE MIXED *Heirloom*

Best treated as a hardy biennial. Tall 2m (6') plants are loaded with fully double flowers in rose, salmon, buff, yellow, red or white with a cushion center. Will not bloom until the second year.

6517 – DOUBLE APRICOT

Beautiful, fully double blooms. An old fashioned cottage garden biennial. Full sun essential for best blooming.

Sow seed 3 mm (1/8") deep and 2.5 cm (1") apart directly outdoors in a sunny site with well drained soil in late May or in late August/early September in Zone 5 and up. Thin plants to 30 cm (12") apart in the garden.

6527 – VINCENZA BLUE

Reliably perennial in Zones 7 and 8 but is hardy to Zone 5 with protection. A summer long performer that withstands heat and drought conditions. Grow as a hedge or in large patches. Bees and butterflies love the deep blue, fragrant blossoms.

NEW! Large 12-18 cm (5-7") wide flowers in yellow, mahogany and bi-colours all with black-brown centres occur June through August. Germination in 14 to 21 days at 20 C (70 F). Flowers in the second year. Water only when stressed by drought in the morning so that foliage dries before evening.

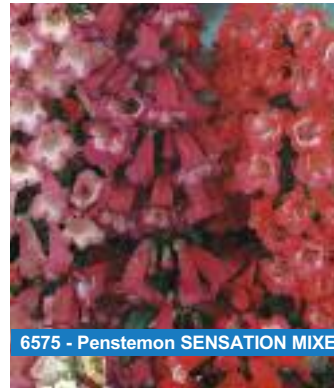

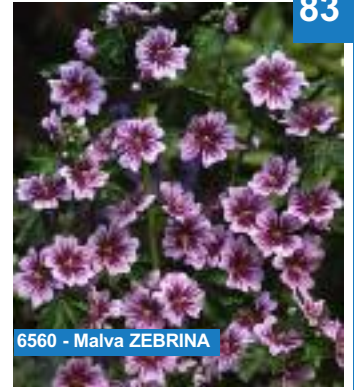

(*Lupinus polyphyllus* x hybrid)

A somewhat finicky perennial to start, it enjoys cooler soil temperatures of 16C (60F) for germination which takes about 20 days. Soaking seed for 24 hours before sowing is recommended.

6530 – RUSSELL'S HYBRIDS MIXED COLOURS

Blooms June through July. A perennial valued for its tall, colourful spikes of blue, red, rose, white yellow and blue/white bi-colours. Requires moist soils in full sun to light shade. Height 90cm (36"). Reliably hardy to Zone 4.

Did you know...

Preventing recurrent disease in the garden is best accomplished by removing diseased foliage completely rather than digging dead plant material back into the garden or composting.

Growing tip...

Wallflower, which belongs to the Brassica family, is at home in sunny sites with well-draining soils. Wallflowers are happiest in soils that tend to remain moist after draining.



6555 - Lychnis MALTESE CROSS

LYCHNIS

(*Lychnis chalcedonica*)
1,650 sds/g

Blooms the first year from early March sowings. Germinates at 20C (70F) in 28 days. Do not cover seed as they respond to light for improved germination. Pre-chill seed prior to planting. Zone 4.

6555 – MALTESE CROSS

Large showy umbels of brilliant scarlet red flowers sit high above the foliage May through August. Rich green foliage is very fine, almost hair-like in appearance. For borders and cutflowers. Performs well in dry, sandy soils. Mature height is close to 90cm (36").

MALVA

(*Malva* spp.) 400 sds/g
Tender perennial. Sow outdoors early May at a site in full sun or partial shade and well-drained soil. Space the plants 30-45cm (12-18") apart in the garden. Zone 6.

Grows to 100cm (4') tall. Strong, erect stems are loaded with 5cm (2"), cup shaped, purple flowers that are heavily veined with a dark purple. An old fashioned favourite!

OZARK SUNDROP

(*Oenothera* spp.) 175 sds/g
Carefree, ground hugging plants that enjoy hot, sunny locations and poorer soil conditions. Sow indoors January through February, germinate at 20C (70F) for 14-21 days. Seeds germinate better when given a cold treatment prior to sowing. Transplant to the garden 30cm (12") apart. Zone 4.

6570 – OENOTHERA MISSOURIENSIS

Use as a ground cover rather than accent plants in the garden. Produces large 7.5cm (3") single, poppy-like, lemon yellow pods on its compact plants.

PENSTEMON

(*Penstemon hartwegii*)
2,300 sds/g

Half hardy perennial that requires a winter mulch in areas of severe cold and little snow cover. Germinate seeds at 18-20C (65-70F) for 10-15 days. Plant in full sun, in rich, well drained soil.

6575 – SENSATION MIXED COLOURS

Colourful, snapdragon look-alike tubular flowers of scarlet red are abundant along tall flower spikes. Foliage is neat, often glossy and unusually evergreen. Flowers appear late spring to mid-summer. Height 90cm (36"). Zone 5.

POPPIES

(*Papaver*) 8,000 sds/g
Start indoors late February or March. Germinates at 20C (70F) in 21 days. Grow-on at slightly cooler temperatures. Do not cover seed as light helps induce germination. Outdoor sowing should take place anytime from May to mid-July or late fall for germination the following spring. Zone 3.

ICELAND POPPY

(*Papaver nudicale*)

6580 – MIXED COLOURS

Large 10cm (4") flowers in a full colour range sit atop fine bright green fern-like foliage. Strong stems withstand harsh wind and rain for a long lasting show. Height 45cm (18").

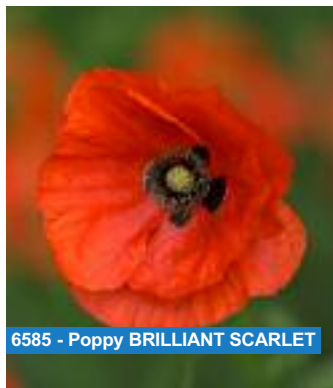

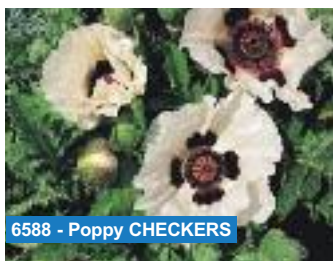

Very large 12cm (5") flowers with light yellow tips on golden yellow petals that encircle a soft green centre. Free blooming plants reach 1 m (3') garden height.

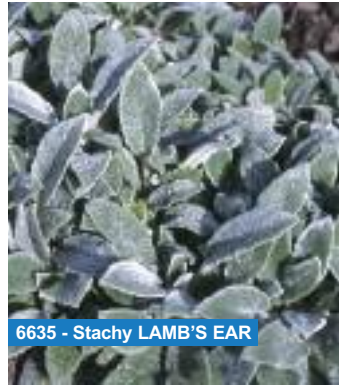

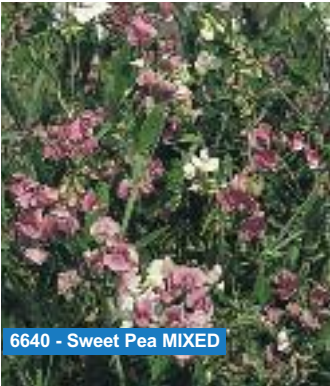

VIOLA

(*Viola cornuta*)

750 - 1,000 sds/g

An evergreen perennial growing up to 20cm (8") tall. It is hardy to zone 5. Treat as an annual in colder climates. The flowers are hermaphrodite (have both male and female parts) and are pollinated by insects. Soil pH should be close to 6 as Violas prefer slightly acid soils. Grow in semi-shade (woodland margins) or full sun. Keep Violas moist during dry periods.

6660 – MIXED COLOURS

Grow as pansies in all respects. Beautiful blossoms that resemble violets, although slightly larger and more tolerant of heat and drought. Flowers all summer long in sun or partial shade. Also named "Johnny Jump-up."

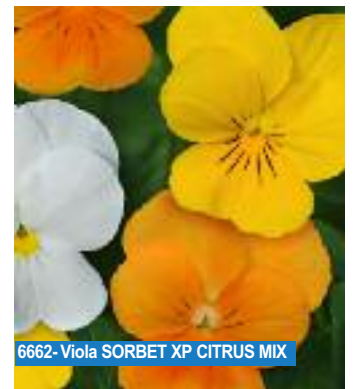

Bushy plants about 40cm (16") across are covered with four-clawed clusters of orange, rose, red and yellow shaded flowers. Uniform plants bloom early spring. Easy to grow.

LEGUMES AND FORAGE CROPS

6700 – CAT GRASS

A quick to germinate grass for feline digestive assistance. An irresistible finicky cat treat.

6705 – FALL RYE

The most widely used fall green manure for capturing soil nitrogen. Good winter cover, too. Sow from mid September to October at 125kg/hectare (110lb/acre).

6735 – WHITE CLOVER

Robust, adaptive & drought resistant. Full sun is best. Try overseeding into established lawns or in areas where turfgrasses tend to struggle. Sow in spring or late summer at 9kg/hectare (8lb/acre). 500g sows 3,000ft² (300 m²).

6740 – SWEET CLOVER (YELLOW BLOSSOM)

Great for breaking up heavy or compacted soils. Full sun. A favourite of bees. Sow at 13.5 kg/hectare (12 lb/acre).

6710 – OATS

A great nurse crop to control weeds. Can be sown spring or fall. Tolerant of most soils. Sow as a crop at 22kg/ha (20 lb/acre). As a green manure, sow at 76kg/ha (70 lb/acre).

6715 – ORCHARD GRASS

This cool season, shade tolerant forage grass used as a pasture grass. Grows well on poor or shallow soils. Sow in spring or early fall at 33kg/hectare (30lb/acre).

6725 – RED CLOVER (DOUBLE CUT)

Red clover has a deep taproot that improves soil permeability and brings nutrients up from the subsoil. Sow in spring at 16.8 kg/hectare (15 lb/acre).

6730 – TIMOTHY

Timothy thrives under cool, humid conditions and in heavy soils. Vigorous root system. A favourite for soil stabilization. Sow in spring at 13.4kg/ha (12 lb/acre).

6675 – ALFALFA

A drought resistant, permanent cover crop in gardens and fields. Sow at 22.5kg/ha (20 lb/acre). Grows 30-90cm tall.

6680 – ALSIKE CLOVER

Smallish leaves, prolific white to pink flowers. Lies flat but grows to 60cm (2') tall, ideal for wet, acid soil. Sow at 4.5kg/ha (4lb/acre).

6685 – BIRDSFOOT TREFOIL

Excellent forage legume for long-term pasture. Pretty yellow flowers in late spring through summer. Sow at 3.6-4.5kgs (8-10lb) per acre.

6690 – BROME GRASS

A deep, hardy root system that survives drought and tough winter conditions. Sow in spring or early fall at up to 33kg/hectare (30lb/acre)

6695 – BUCKWHEAT

A green manure that smothers weeds, protects the soil surface and provides habitat for pollinating and other beneficial insects. Sow at 52kg/ha (48 lb/acre).

6742 – DAIKON RADISH

Cover crop radish variety protects soil surface stability. Sow at 52kg/ha (48lb/acre).



MICROCLOVER

('Pipolina')

Requires regular mowing to keep the dwarf, low growing and spreading habit. A genetic trait bred into Pipolina activates in response to repeated mowing. No mowing, less shrinking. It is ideal for over-seeding into lawns and sport turf. Wear & tear actually enhances the dominance of Microclover in lawns. Avoid high nitrogen fertilizer. When seeded into lawns, it thrives under the regular mowing height of 5 to 7cm (2-3"). To increase the amount of Microclover growing in the lawn, reduce or eliminate nitrogen fertilizers. Sow at 25 g per 100 m² (1076 sq. ft.) when over-seeding into a turf based lawn. Water regularly until established. Sow in spring and late summer.

How to Grow

In mid April to mid June, scatter the seed on the surface and gently rake into the soil. Microclover can also be applied as a broadcast over-seeding onto established lawns. Requires regular mowing. Success with Microclover is all about mowing to 5 to 7 cm (2-3") height as directed on the package.

6737 – MICROCLOVER

Ornamental white clover for use in lawns and sport turf. Must be mown to maintain dwarf growing habit. Sow mixed with a carrier such as fine sand. Use 25g seed to four cups sand. Sow at 25 g per 52m² (560ft²).
